# BOARD OF DIRECTORS NEWS



PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Our Medina Sandstone Society started out 2020 anticipating that it would be a very special year. High on our list was our intention to celebrate the 10th anniversary of our Medina Sandstone Trust Grant program with a variety of special activities spaced throughout the year. Of course we know now that this year was special for a very different reason! COVID-19 changed everyone's life dramatically and even now, more than 4 months after the pandemic response began, our activities are still hampered by restrictions on travel (e.g. Hall of Fame road trips) and the need for social distancing.

This annual newsletter and its associated Stone Cutter support drive and Sandstone Trust fundraising usually goes out at the end of May. We delayed publication by two months in the expectation that the pandemic would be over or, at least, we would have a clear picture of the future. Unfortunately the crisis has not yet abated, but we are working hard to continue our programs, albeit in considerably different ways than in previous years. #### JOHN RYAN SOCIETY

It is with great honor that the Medina Sandstone Society in cooperation with the Medina High School History department under the direction of teacher Todd Bensley proudly presented the fourth annual John Ryan Sandstone Scholarship to **Alissa Blount**.

Alissa is a 2019 Graduate of Medina Senior High School and is now studying nursing at Daemen College

The \$1000 scholarship was awarded to Alissa for writing the winning essay about the village of Medina, themed "Roots in the Past, Eyes on the Future. Alissa's essay entitled "A Rockin' Little Village" made a great impression on the committee comprised of Medina Sandstone members – Jim Hancock, Kellie Hurrell, Rob Klino and Mary Zangerle. She conducted personal interviews with members of the business community and came to realize through her research and was able to convey the essay theme was more than just a theme for a scholarship contest.

The John Ryan School of Historical Excellence was founded

in 2015. The name of the school springs from the legend of John Ryan who opened the first commercial Medina sandstone quarry in Medina in 1837. Graduating seniors of the John Ryan School are awarded the title of "John Ryan Scholar" which is stamped on their Medina High School diploma and will have their names permanently displayed on an honorary wall at Medina High School.



#### SANDSTONE HALL OF FAME

The Medina Sandstone Society inducted four new members into the Medina Sandstone Hall of Fame on October 17, 2019 during a ceremony at Medina City Hall. These structures were selected after almost 400 miles of roadtrips for the selection committee - our longest thus far. Inductees in the Class of 2019 are:

- Zion Episcopal Church in Palmyra, NY
- St. Peter's Episcopal in Geneva, NY
- St. Peter's RC Church in Rome, NY
- Watson-Curtze Mansion in Erie, PA

Each structure was judged to be an outstanding example of the use of Medina Sandstone in the design and construction of a superior structure. The Hall of Fame inductees have been beautifully maintained or restored and stands today as a lasting example of the beauty and longevity of sandstone quarried in Orleans County over a century ago.

This marks the sixth year for the Sandstone Hall of Fame which now comprises a total of 29 structures located throughout New York and Pennsylvania. These inductees were selected from the 65 nominations submitted for consideration by the HOF selection committee.

A special note of gratitude to Takeform Architectural Graphics for the design and creation of our Hall of Fame plaques. This year marks the third major change in the HOF display. The first upgrade was in 2018 when the photos were changed from a monotone sepia color to full color. In 2019 Takeform changed the mounting method to allow placement of individual plaques for more arrangement flexibility. Without this change we would have run out of space on the display wall, but now we have the ability to handle several more years. The Hall of Fame is open to the public during normal office hours in the Medina City Hall.

#### **APPRECIATION DAY**

Promoting community pride in the Medina-Shelby-Ridgeway area has always been part of our MSS mission. It was clear from the beginning of the COVID-019 pandemic that our community was going to depend greatly on the skills and courage of our local healthcare workers and our Board wanted to send a message of support to those people. So an Appreciation Day was held on April 23 and on that day pizzas were provided for all healthcare workers in Medina. This included staff at Medina Memorial Hospital, Applegate, Orchard Manor Nursing Home and the Willows. Avanti's delivered pizzas to Orchard Manor and the Willows, while Mark's Pizzeria made deliveries to the hospital and Applegate. A second pizza delivery was made to facilities to accommodate those on the night shift. The total donation of 30 sheet pizzas fed a combined 200 staff members at the four facilities.

In a separate effort, we solicited donations through our website and Facebook which were matched by the MSS Board. In this way we were able to give \$500 to the Ministry of Concern to support their work in providing the basic necessities to families who could otherwise not afford these essentials.

These organizations and many others have been sorely tested in this health emergency, but our healthcare workers and social support groups have done everything we could have expected and more. As we said in our letter that accompanied the pizzas "You are truly our heroes every day, but especially today, tomorrow, and for the weeks to come. We are truly grateful for all that you do! Stay safe, we need you!"
